Introduction

I work in the Bremond Historical Museum, a small museum dedicated to the history of our community. On any of the city's festival days, invariably an out-of-town visitor will come in and ask about a relative buried in St Mary's Cemetery. The dialog may go something like this:

[Visitor] Do you have any information about people buried in St Mary's Cemetery? [Me] The museum does not. Have you checked with the church? [Visitor] I have, but the church does not have a record of the burial. My relative's was name, and died sometime between dates (late 1800s and early 1900s). [Me] If you will leave me some contact information, I will check on it, and let you know what I find out.

Given that the dates are in the late 1800s or early 1900s, I guess that the burial was in the older part of St Mary' Cemetery. I would walk through that part of the cemetery to see what I can find. I may not find who I'm looking for, but I may find a gravesite of someone who might be related, and I pass that information to the person asking the question. If I could not find any information, I would look at other resources, such as Cemeteries of Robertson County, Texas (by Verna Corn Floyd, 1980) or the internet. Some of the internet sites cite the Floyd book as a starting point for their information. I have found some errors and omissions in those references.

Let me say something about data errors, especially from markers that are very old, say in excess of 75 years old. There are several factors that contribute to the accuracy of the information collected, such as the material of the marker, the engraving of the inscription, cleanliness of the marker, and language.

There is a wide variety of materials used to make markers: stone (marble, granite, etc.), concrete, wood, and metal. I know of one marker that used multiple materials, including petrified wood. All of these materials deteriorate over time as they are affected by the weather, some more vulnerable than others, thus, making the information harder to read. Some markers are painted, and as the paint deteriorates, the information becomes harder to read.


On today's markers, engravings are nice, deep, and crisp. One hundred years ago, many inscriptions were scratched and gouged into the material. Engravings were shallow and easily worn down by time and weather. Some tried to enhance the inscriptions by using a small paintbrush and paint to highlight the words. Because the engravings were not crisp and deep, the "enhanced" lettering was not crisp, sometimes with letters running together. All these factors contribute to the diminished readability of what was written.

Sad to say, many of today's cemeteries, especially the smaller cemeteries, are not maintained very well, if at all. Over time the markers become dirty. Dirt and mold become embedded into the material. And then there is that green stuff – lichen – that grows all over the marker, obliterating some, or all, of the inscription, making the information hard to read. Some try to clean the markers using a variety of chemicals. The results might look OK for a while, but the chemicals can expedite the deterioration of the marker. I use water, a plastic scraper, a stiff plastic/nylon brush, and a plastic/nylon scouring pad to get the lichen and surface dirt off of the marker. Then I spray a biological agent called D/2 on the marker. D/2 will finish killing the lichen and pull some of the embedded dirt out of the marker. (To get the D/2, go to the website, gravestonecleaner.com; click on the link to retailers to find a retailer near you. You can order D/2 online, but shipping is expensive; D/2 is not cheap either.)

One other thing that inhibits the reading and understandability of the information on a marker is language: at least it was for me. St Mary's Cemetery belongs to St Mary's Catholic Church. The Catholic Church, in Bremond, was essentially started by the Polish immigrants living in Bremond and surrounding areas. Consequently, many marker inscriptions are in Polish, which contribute to mistakes interpreting the information. An online translator helped with the months of the year, but a helping friend pointed out a couple of terms that referred to family relationships, not names. For instance, the above mentioned references give a listing for Anastasia Corka. Corka translates to "daughter", and in this case it was followed by Wla i Jul *Nowakow.* So the listing should be Anastasia Nowakow, daughter of Wla and Jul Nowakow. Even knowing about such family references, I still made the same mistake, and did not catch it until I was rechecking my data. Additionally, it seems that many times, the builders of older gravestone markers did not employ concepts of design. You would like to see significant items centered on the marker, with the most important items accented by the use of font styles and sizes. I found markers where the last name is split from one line to the next. There is an instance where the first name is in one font at the end of a line, the next name is a different font – a bit larger at the beginning of the next line, and was followed a larger, different font centered on the next line, suggesting a last name, but is actually a reference to an organizational affiliation. It took substantial assistance to clear up this issue. Foreign language inexperience is a major barrier to proper and correct translation and interpretation of many grave markers.

Given that there are errors and omissions in the existing data that I have reviewed, I set out to catalog the markers in the older part of St Mary's Cemetery. In the table that follows, I give a reference to the location of the markers, by row and sequence. This reference is a matter of perspective. Rows of markers are not always straight, nor parallel. So, when I say a marker is in row 4, someone else may see it as row 2 or row 3. The markers are sequenced, 1 2 3 ..., by row. This does not reflect the relative position of a marker in one row compared to a marker in another row. You may be standing at the second marker in a row, with the third marker right next to it; but the fourth marker may be 20, 30, or more feet further down the row. The sequence numbers considers the markers of those who are unknown; unknown because the inscription was unreadable, or there was no inscription, at all. In the old section of the cemetery, there are almost 50 markers representing those who are unknown. These markers are not included in the table, below.

If you are standing at St Mary's Catholic Church, looking at the cemetery, there are two service roads into the cemetery. The older part of the cemetery is to the right of the service road on the right. The part that I cataloged goes from the street to just beyond the trees. Just beyond the trees, next to the service road, there are some sets of markers outlined with concrete borders; my project went up to these "family plots". Rows are numbered from the service road, and markers are sequenced from the street. The following photo shows St Mary's Cemetery; the project area is outlined in red.



I undertook this service project out of my own volition. I felt that questions were being asked, but answers were not necessarily forthcoming. Will this document provide the answers? Certainly, not in all cases, but hopefully, this document will provide a better opportunity for answers.

The information presented below is not perfect. I apologize for any mistakes that are discovered. My perceptions of what I see on a marker, and my interpretations of what I see, may not be exactly accurate, but hopefully, it is close.

Conclusion

This project was not easy, but personally rewarding. I faced all the challenges mentioned above, and in regards to the language issue, I want to thank Michael Kurtin and Dennis Kubiak of the Polish Genealogical Society of Texas (PGST), and John Cebrowski and the Polish Heritage Center in Panna Maria, Texas. Their assistance help make me aware of some mistakes found in other documents.

I don't think there are any omissions in my data, but I would not be surprised if there are some mistakes, like an "l" when it should be a "l", or a date that is incorrect, or something in the Notes that is incorrect or confusing. Should anyone find a omission/mistake in this document, please contact me through the Bremond Historical Society.

Family Plots

There are several instances, in the Old Section, where markers gathered in groups and outlined with a border. The border could be concrete or brick lines around the markers, or a fence. The grouping of the markers suggests a commonality between them. That commonality could be a relationship through direct blood-lines and/or through marriage. With this assumption, I refer to these groups as "family plots". In some cases, you can assign a dominate family name to a family plot, but in other cases, there are so many different family names that a dominate name is not evident. Some last names appear in multiple plots. For this reason, I did not give names to family plots.
